Update from Linen Services The laundry at Foresterhill continues to operate under contingency measures, with Linen Services facing sustained service pressures. They have asked us to pass on their gratitude for the support and patience all teams have shown to date. All areas are receiving adequate supplies of clean linen; you can support your laundry colleagues by remembering the following:

- Change beds when necessary, ensuring this is within the 7-day window
- Towels must be used appropriately e.g., use paper towels for spills, not fabric towels.
- Throws/blankets are for the use of patients only.
- If you have more clean linen than you need, please see if neighbouring services can use it, instead of returning to the laundry via the dirty waste stream. This wastes valuable time relaundering already clean supplies
- Please make sure you are only sending linen to be laundered. The team have recovered headphones, remote controls, and glasses, amongst other items. These can damage our machines, further affecting the service they can provide.
- A cheap biro pen can end up costing hundreds of pounds; ink stains cannot be removed, and this
 linen must be disposed of. Take your pen out of your pocket before sending scrubs to be
 laundered.

Linen Services are taking this opportunity to review the service they provide. They will be in touch with teams directly to discuss their requirements; please bear in mind your future service may change. The team will always ensure departments have what they need but some ad-hoc arrangements may end. Thank you again for the support you have shown the team.

Change from coloured disposable aprons to white disposable aprons From next Monday (21 August) coloured disposable aprons for different nursing and domestic activities will no longer be available to order. All staff should use white aprons. This change will ensure we have a consistent, reliable, supply. As per standard infection control precautions (SICPs), you should continue to change aprons between patients and following completion of a procedure or task. This change is expected to last for around 6 months. All existing stock should be used, however, from 21 August only white aprons will be available to order from the National Distribution Centre via SKU 248353. White aprons will be supplied to NHS Grampian free of charge until April 2024.
