Foresterhill car parking reminder Maintenance and construction work will cause disruption to car parking on the Foresterhill site from this weekend:

- The car park adjacent to the Rotunda entrance to ARI will be closed off on Friday, to allow for crane access and roof repairs tomorrow (18 November). Works should be complete, and the car park returned to use, at 5pm.
- A temporary one-way system will be introduced to the staff (shale) car park on Foresterhill Health Campus from 6pm on Sunday (19 November), for a period of approximately 6 weeks. This is to allow essential construction work for the Flood Mitigation and Greenspace projects. There will be a construction compound in the car park, which will mean a reduction of around 25 spaces. We apologise for any inconvenience these works will cause; please follow the traffic management signs.
