Staff car parking - Foresterhill Health Campus Thank you to everyone who completed our survey on car parking options for this site, and for your patience while we collated the results. The attached was presented to GAPF at their October meeting. Following this, we wanted to let you know what the next steps will be:

- There will be NO changes to the current arrangements before 1 April 2024. Winter is a challenging time in the health service, we want you to have certainty about the car parking arrangements. This means you will be able to use the multi-storey car park, from Level 6 and above, when coming to work. Please bear in mind we need to ensure patients can get parked too, therefore the lower levels must be kept clear for their use.
- We will be pursuing a permanent change to the conditions of use of the multi-storey car park. This is being done in consultation with the funders of the facility.
- The results of the survey, along with your individual feedback, made it clear you do not believe a permit system is the right option for the site. As such, we will not be taking those options any further at this time.
- We do need to make sure staff car parking is being protected for staff. We will be further investigating a vehicle registration scheme and the use of numberplate recognition.
- Your feedback has highlighted there is a lot we could be doing to better manage access to and from the site. You mentioned the shuttle bus service, more facilities for cyclists, and the relatively limited public transport options. Over the coming months, we will be developing a plan to improve access. This will involve discussions with bus companies and the organisations we share the site with. This plan will be a key part of any request to change the conditions of use of the multi-storey car park.

We hope this update is helpful; we will continue to share progress reports in the coming months.

SWAN Secure Web Access (SWAN SWA) Remote Access Due to essential maintenance the SWAN Secure Web Access service will be unavailable intermittently during the following dates/times:

- Wednesday 1st November 18:00-22:00

During these times the use of SWAN Secure Web Access will be limited therefore if you require access to NHS Grampian systems during these times an alternative means of access should be considered.
