Ask Adam Today we are pleased to bring you the reintroduced staff Q&A with Adam Coldwells joining us for his first session since becoming the interim NHS Grampian Chief Executive. Pressures across the system, bed numbers, diagnosis delays and rota policies are among the 13 questions Adam addresses in the today's Q&A. Trakcare Inpatient Electronic Patient Record (IP EPR) Upcoming Changes Over the coming months, the IP EPR Programme will be introducing several changes to the Trakcare IP EPR following user feedback. The first changes will be available across NHS Grampian to all users from Tuesday 12 March and include:

- Improvements to the Patient Admission assessment (PAA) and ASSSKINGME which will be now split across 2 questionnaires. The reason for doing this is to allow an increased level of guidance and prompting on the screen, to help facilitate the admission conversation and ASSSKINGME assessment.
- We have also added a "confirmation of risks on admission" section below the ASSSKINGME assessment.
