COVID-19Brief




Here is the brief for Friday 12 November 2021.

Food supplies The availability of many food commodities has become very limited - or no availability at all – due to multiple factors, including COVID-19, Brexit, global markets, crop failures, tinplate and plastics shortages, and so on. This is now having a daily effect on the deliveries being received with some turning up 25-30 lines short or substitutes received, resulting in daily adaptations and changes to menus. The knock-on effects of this are the ability to provide accurate allergen information, the quality of some dishes due to ingredients missing, and reduced consumer choice. This is not just an NHS Grampian issue; it is impacting across NHS Scotland and the greater global economy and is being raised at a national level.

We want to make you all aware of this situation, as the purchase of many products is outwith our control. The hospital kitchens will endeavour to notify all wards, cafes, and Aroma units affected where changes have been made to dishes, particularly where this results in changes to allergens present. It is equally important that this is widely communicated at ward level so staff can be vigilant, especially where vulnerable patients are concerned.

What do you want to know? Thanks to everyone who has already submitted their suggestions for additional data we could share in this brief. Most of the queries so far have focused on the vaccination status of patients in hospital, but you're also asking about whether COVID positive patients are in hospital due to the virus, or other reasons, and about the impact of COVID in pregnancy. We've passed all the queries to the Health Intelligence team, and we'll look to share more information in the briefs next week. The form is still open if you would like to pop in any new, or different, data questions.
