The Queen's Platinum Jubilee Further to confirming how NHS Scotland staff will commemorate this event, the Scottish Government has now converted the additional day of leave into an additional Public Holiday for 2022-23 on Friday 3 June 2022. Please disregard previously communicated arrangements.


Staff required to work on Friday 3 June 2022 will be eligible for the rates of pay and all other terms and conditions applicable on a designated Public Holiday.

The additional public holiday (defined by an employee's weekly contracted hours divided by 5) will apply to all NHS Grampian staff. The calculation of this entitlement is always proportionate to the number of basic contracted hours worked and

Table 3 in the <u>Agenda for Change Annual Leave Policy</u> (intranet link, networked devices only) provides the calculation for a range of contracted hours.

The state of the virus There are indications of improvement with a slowing of community infections (according to ONS infection prevalence and cases). In the past week, there has been a slight increase in admissions 'for' COVID-19 but some very early signs of a reduction in hospital onset cases. Daily occupancy was at its highest on 3 April, when we had 198 COVID-19 patients in our hospitals. It has fallen slightly since, but it is too early to say if we have peaked. On a welcome note, ward closures due to outbreaks have halved compared to the same time last week.

SIREN study – what next? NHS Grampian is one of the boards participating in this UK-wide study, which is looking at whether prior infection with COVID-19 prevents against future re-infection, particularly by studying healthcare workers.
