

coronavirus VID-19Brief

Here is the brief for Tuesday 8 June 2021.

COVID-19 vaccination programme It is exactly six months since the first doses of COVID-19 vaccination were administered, starting with health & social care staff, before expanding out into a full public programme. Over the last six months a huge amount of work has been undertaken to identify and run mass vaccination clinics in Elgin, Peterhead, Fraserburgh, Macduff, Huntly, Inverurie, Stonehaven, Banchory, and at P&J Live in Aberdeen, to recruit and train the right staff, to offer community outreach and workplace clinics, and to speed up the delivery of the programme in Moray when case numbers there rose. The latest figures (below, from Public Health Scotland) show the progress that has been made from a standing start and so we say thank you to everyone involved; no matter how big (or small) your role, you have contributed to the success of this programme.



% coverage in people aged 18+ years by dose and by NHS Board



Grampian data Thank you for your patience with the delay in sharing local data, we are now able to present the figures for today and the previous three days. This also includes the 7-day rolling positivity rate. As a reminder, this rate is arrived at by dividing the number of positive tests in the past 7 days by the number of tests carried out in the past 7 days. Repeat tests are included in both categories.

The figure for the "daily number of new people tested" is only for the number of tests for people who have not been tested previously.

Fast Track Cities – Zero stigma, zero new HIV infections, zero AIDS related deaths In February 2020, Aberdeen City signed the Paris Declaration which pledges support to the Fast Track Cities (FTC) initiative as part of the global focus on Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV), prevention, diagnosis and treatment. The signing of this declaration indicates the commitment of Aberdeen City in zero stigma, zero new HIV infections and zero AIDS-related deaths by 2030.

The FTC steering group have worked to establish a strategic plan and wider partnership and the plan was recently endorsed by the Integration Joint Board. It is intended for the plan to be a working document and therefore has been updated to reflect the impact of COVID, as a result the FTC steering group would now like to undertake a wide consultation to help inform this work going forward.

This consultation is open from now until the 2nd of July. It is appreciated if you could therefore take a few minutes to complete this <u>consultation</u> and share the link to the consultation within your networks. Although this document reflects the commitment made by Aberdeen City, we hope in time Aberdeenshire and Moray will also join the Fast-Track Cities Initiative which will ensure that the Grampian is recognised as one and in the Northeast of Scotland we all support better prevention, diagnosis, treatment for HIV and helps work towards zero stigma.
