Orange Stream bags issues Our healthcare waste contractor, Tradebe, has reported issues recently regarding metal items being disposed of in orange bags. As the bags were being shredded, these metal items caused damage to the plant which in turn led to downtime in processing for the repairs to be carried out. This downtime creates a backlog of waste which in turn could impact on the ability to service sites on time. While there is **no** suggestion these bags originated here, it is a good opportunity for all of us to remember metal items should **never** be placed into orange bags for disposal; low risk metal items for disposal in orange stream should always be placed into sharps bins.
