**Staff vaccination clinics** Two more staff vaccination clinics have been arranged, as follows:

- Wednesday 21 December Ward 17, Woodend Hospital, 1 4.30pm
- Thursday 22 December Level 1 Tutorial Room, Green Zone, ARI, 10.30am 4.30pm

These clinics are open to all staff, offering 'flu and COVID-19 vaccination, depending on eligibility. Appointments not required.

Staying with vaccination, all clinics in Grampian are now open for drop-in by children aged 2-5, and primary/secondary school pupils. There are clinics in Elgin, Huntly, Peterhead, Fraserburgh, Macduff, Inverurie, Banchory, Stonehaven, and Aberdeen – Airyhall, Bridge of Don, and ACVC (former John Lewis). Details of the festive opening arrangements for all clinics are in Volume 3 of the Festive Service Arrangements guide, attached to the email used to send this brief.

Please note access to the ePayroll system **must** be done via a network PC; it is not possible to access your e-Payslip outwith the network, or on a smartphone/tablet

**Virtual Visiting** If you work in a clinical area which has iPads to use for virtual visiting, please check all devices are working correctly as a matter of urgency, so there is time available to address any issues which arise.

Clinical Biochemistry Referral Sample Handling During Postal Strike & Public Holidays The Clinical Biochemistry Department sends many samples to referral labs for specialist testing via Royal Mail. There will be further strike action at Royal Mail on 23/24 December. Please be aware of the following:

- The laboratory is using alternative delivery options via courier services where possible, but ask if it is all possible for service users to avoid sending non urgent samples during this period.
- Steps will be taken by the lab to ensure the stability and quality of these samples as far as possible. However, samples sent by Royal Mail to referral labs will be delayed, and in some instances, may even require a repeat sample to be taken.
