System pressures – your feedback At the beginning of February we announced a 4-week test of a new way for you to provide feedback on the pressures in health & social care and, if you wished, to suggest some solutions. The test of change is still running, and you are welcome to complete this form anonymously or to email gram.systempressurefeedback@nhs.scot

Broadly speaking, the feedback we have received so far covers the following themes: staff wellbeing/staffing issues, delayed discharge, leadership, and the challenges facing primary care. We are grateful for the honesty shown, and for the suggestions made. Some of these touch on big issues of policy and/or situations which aren't unique to Grampian and are therefore difficult for us to solve on our own. However, many of you made smaller, practical suggestions, so in the coming days, we're going to sharing the answers to some of these and we hope you find this helpful.

Staff vaccination clinics There will be a staff vaccination clinic tomorrow (22 February) in the antenatal clinic, Aberdeen Maternity Hospital, 9.30am - 3.30pm. This clinic is also open to anyone who is pregnant and yet to get their 'flu/COVID-19 jabs.

Mental Health Nurses Day We hope all the mental health nursing teams have had a great day, celebrating the 5th Mental Health Nurses Day. A huge thank you to all of them for their hard work, each and every day.

National Adult Support and Protection 2023 - Spotting the signs of adult self-neglect Normally, the key focus for healthcare professionals is to enable our patients to live safe and healthy lives. Significant challenges exist when patient decision-making or behaviour appears to be actively negative and harmful to themselves. Whilst Local Authorities are the lead agency in Adult Support and Protection, NHS Grampian staff are key partners. We are often instrumental in both identifying and supporting patients at risk of harm through self-neglect. This article describes a real-life situation of self-neglect (intranet link, networked devices only). We encourage professionals and teams to use it in supervisions and case discussions.

EIS strike action As the parents and carers among you will be aware, there are two days of national strike action planned by the EIS next Tuesday and Wednesday (28 February & 1 March). Schools are providing information directly on closures/alternative arrangements; as with previous school strikes you should speak to your line manager to make alternative arrangements (e.g., shift swap, working at home, annual leave) if you are unable to come into work as a direct result of this action.

Reminder - Waste e-learning modules These modules were revised towards the end of 2022. There will not be an automatic reminder sent out to advise you when they are due to be completed. There are now two modules:

Module 1: Non-hazardous waste should be completed by all staff;

Module 2: Hazardous Healthcare Waste should be completed by any staff who either produce or have to handle or dispose of healthcare wastes.

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There is also an e-Toolbox talk: <u>Changes to healthcare waste segregation</u> aimed at staff who produce healthcare waste. It covers changes to segregation of both Cyto and non-Cyto medicinal sharps and pharma wastes. Evidence from regular waste audits suggests not everyone is aware of these changes, so please encourage all relevant staff to complete this Toolbox talk.
