First Aid at work This training is now delivered in a blended approach which involves applying for the First Aid modules and completing ahead of the practical session These are available on Turas under the OHS page. Managers must ensure staff have time, in work, to complete these

There are 3 options:

- Emergency First Aid at Work 7 modules and 3.5 practical hours (half day)
- First Aid at Work new staff 13 modules and 12 practical hours (2 days)
- First Aid at Work Refresh –for those have previously completed the course before and due to expire-13 modules and 6 practical hours. (1day)

Application form for modules to be completed, with Manager's approval, are again available on Turas. Managers should refer to the First Aid at Work Policy available on the intranet to guide them through the risk assessment for First Aid provision within their workplace

Please note, if you have already applied and completed the modules you **must** attend a practical course otherwise no certificate will be issued. You may be asked to complete the modules again if there is a lengthy lapse. Timeframe to complete both the modules and the practical is 10 weeks. Dates available at the Suttie Centre, with occasional Elgin dates available too

Scottish National Diabetes Inpatient Audit (NaDIA) The Scottish National Diabetes Inpatient Audit (NaDIA) will run 9-15 May and we will be taking part across all acute adult inpatient wards in ARI, Woodend, and Dr Gray's. The audit will be carried out by our diabetologists and specialist nurses, looking to gather data on, for example, incidence and severity of hypoglycaemia, general foot care, and prescribing and administration practices.

Teams do not need to do anything to prepare and there will be very minimal impact on daily routines.

Up to 15% of inpatients will have diabetes. People with diabetes are more likely to have adverse outcomes compared to those without diabetes and improving inpatient care for people with diabetes is one of the key priorities of the Scottish diabetes improvement plan. Data will be collected on the online national portal, Sci-diabetes (https://www.sci-diabetes.scot.nhs.uk/) The audit will give us data at a national, regional, and local level to help drive improvements to care and outcomes, and results will be shared widely once available. Sustainable Postal Practices We are committed to being as sustainable as possible and ensuring we spend our budgets appropriately. One area we are keen to improve is our posting practice. Here are some simple things we need you to remember:

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- Prior to printing and posting, consider if your communication can be sent digitally. If not, can your communications include links and QR codes to reduce the document size?
- Ensure correct sizes of envelopes are used for items.
- Ensure second class mail is used as default for external mail. Line management approval is required for first class mail and should only be used if deemed clinically or legally necessary.
- Postage priority should not be written on the envelope.
