Board visit to Dr Gray's Hospital We've been sharing information this week about ongoing work to develop a dedicated Dr Gray's Hospital Plan for the Future. This strategic focus on DGH, and its significant role, saw the NHS Grampian Board visit the hospital earlier today. Board members toured the facilities, heard more about the services and spoke with staff about their roles. They then met to discuss what they had heard and share observations. The visit helped develop the Board's understanding of the current challenges and opportunities at Dr Gray's and precedes a paper on its refreshed strategic purpose, which will come to the Board in February 2023.

Consultation open on 'Once for Scotland' Workforce Policies – Supporting the Work-Life Balance There is a national programme of work reviewing existing workforce policies with the aim to promote NHS Scotland as a modern, exemplar employer with consistent employment policy and practice. The first phase of policies (conduct, attendance, capacity, investigation process, bullying and harassment and grievance) were implemented across all NHS Boards in March 2020 followed by the Whistleblowing Standards in April 2021.

The second phase includes policies which support the work-life balance: Flexible Work Pattern, Retirement, Career Break, Special Leave, Maternity, Parent Support, Shared Maternity and Shared Adoption leave, Parental Leave, Breastfeeding, and Adoption, Fostering and Kinship. HEPMA (Hospital Electronic Prescribing and Medicine Administration) Update Over recent months, intensive testing of the HEPMA system has been taking place. This phase is due to conclude in the next few weeks and takes us a significant step closer to introducing HEPMA in NHS Grampian. The local project team are working towards a go live date for some early adopter areas in February 2023. Ahead of that, key activities are underway to integrate HEPMA with other systems (Trak and CDD) and preparing a range of user support and training materials. We are also working with colleagues in Pharmacy to schedule a necessary upgrade to the Pharmacy Stock Control system in January 2023.

With our go live now firmly in our sights, we are stepping up our communication and engagement activities. Some of you visited our drop-in sessions last month, providing the opportunity to see and hear more about HEPMA, and speak to some to pharmacy and nursing colleagues involved in the project. We plan to follow up those sessions with digital drop-ins and will issue dates shortly but meantime, click HEPMA Demo-20221021_091555-Meeting Recording.mp4 to view a digital demo of the prescribing and pharmacy verification functions within HEPMA produced by one of our HEPMA pharmacists, Jill Carnegie. Return to Practice Has your NMC registration lapsed, but you want to return to work as a nurse or midwife? NHS Grampian and Robert Gordon University are working jointly to welcome nurses and midwives whose registration has lapsed to return to practice by providing a short course which is fully funded when candidates successfully join this collaborative employment model.
