# **Project Update**

Progress with planning for The Baird Family Hospital and The ANCHOR Centre is now well underway. The programme is being finalised with construction commencement scheduled for early 2018 and completion in 2020.

The 'Initial Agreement' (first of 3 business cases) was approved by the Board of NHSG in June 2015 and was formally considered by the Capital Investment Group at SGHSCD on 21 July 2015, approval is awaited.

The current work of the project team is focused on development and agreement of the clinical strategy and schedule of accommodation, resulting in confirmation of the clinical brief. Work has started on development of the technical brief with our technical advisors AECOM. Our financial and legal advisors for the project have also been appointed.

In terms of planning, work has commenced with Aberdeen City Council. A Pre Application Notice (PAN) for the project has been submitted, with the first of two successful public consultation events held in June, the second one held on 11 August 2015.

An NPD project office has been set up and is located at the east end of ARI on the corridor leading to the Radiotherapy Centre.

#### **New Building Names**

Earlier this year in March/April, members of the public and staff from across the North East sent in their suggestions for the names of these two major new buildings for the Foresterhill site. A total of 147 suggestions were received for the planned buildings. A Naming Panel of clinical staff, members of the public and senior officials agreed preferred names from a shortlist of suggestions and these names have been endorsed by the Board of NHS Grampian.

The names of the new buildings to be developed on the Foresterhill site are:

- The Baird Family Hospital
- The ANCHOR Centre

# The Baird Family Hospital

The Baird Family Hospital name is in recognition of the contribution made to health by the Baird family over many years in Aberdeen and elsewhere in Scotland. In 1937 Dugald Baird was appointed Regius Professor of Midwifery in Aberdeen. In the three decades he held this post, he made major contributions in many fields including clinical practice, service provision and health policy in reproductive health, perinatal and maternal mortality, social obstetrics and cervical screening. He and his wife, Lady Matilda Deans Baird who was also a physician, established the first free family planning clinic in Aberdeen. In 1951 he started the Aberdeen Maternity and Neonatal Databank, which continues today, linking all obstetric and fertility related events in women from a defined population.

He was knighted in 1959 and when he retired in 1965 he and his wife were awarded the Freedom of the City of Aberdeen for their contribution to medical science and health in the city and beyond.

# The ANCHOR Centre

ANCHOR (Aberdeen and North Centre for Haematology, Oncology and Radiotherapy) is a well-respected and highly regarded 'brand', established in the North for almost two decades. ANCHOR is a name that people of the North-East know well and hold dear. The emotive and powerful connotations of the word ANCHOR represent the safe, secure and strong place that the expert clinicians and health care team strive to give patients to get them through their own personal cancer 'storm'.



# Site Location and Concept Images


# The ANCHOR Centre
